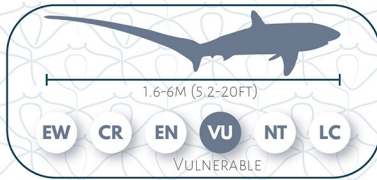


# JUMPING SHARKS!



## COMMON THRESHER SHARK

ALOPIAS VULPINUS

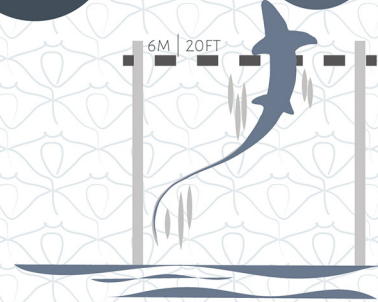


Thresher's tail is as long as the rest of its body...

...and it is used as a weapon!

Tail works like a *whip*, stunning and incapacitating prey!

They can jump up to 6m high!



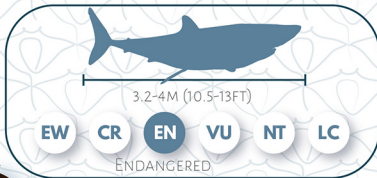
Threshers are mostly seen close to the surface...

...but often live as deep as 100-500 m below!



## SHORTFIN MAKO SHARK

ISURUS OXYRINCHUS



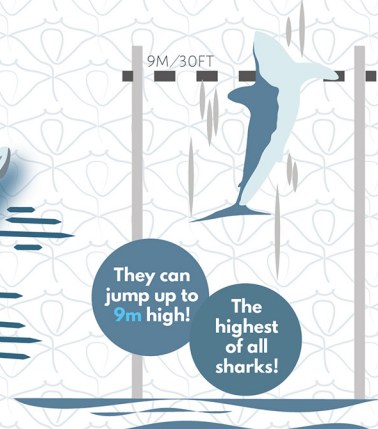
Makos are the fastest sharks in the ocean!

They can travel at constant speed of 35km/h...

...with bursts of more than 80km/h!

They can jump up to 9m high!

The highest of all sharks!



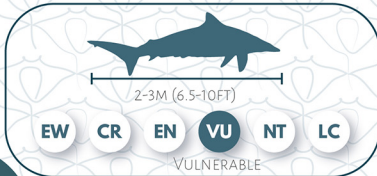
Shortfin mako is one of a few warm-blooded sharks!

They can keep their bodies much warmer than the water around them!



## SPINNER SHARK

CARCHARHINUS BREVIPINNA



Spinner sharks just looove spinning!

They swim into the school of fish with mouths wide open...

...and wild spinning increases their chances of catching a fish!

Look for this black spot...

...to avoid confusing spinner with blacktip shark!

They are spinning out of the water too!

Up to 1.5m high, they can rotate in the air even 3 times!
